# Rules regarding putting vehicles on the BMC-Leyland Car Club Inc Club Permit Scheme.

# BMC-Leyland Car Club Inc CPS (Club Permit Scheme), the committee has decided that as of now, the following rules will now apply:

- 1. A vehicle that is BMC, Leyland, British or European will be admitted to the clubs CPS providing that the vehicle is 25years or older and is classified as a classic vehicle.
- 2. A non-BMC, Leyland, British or European vehicle can be admitted with the permission of the CPS Person and the committee only if that member already has a BMC vehicle with the club. This rule excludes all Japanese, Ford, Holden and the like, subject to Committee approval.
- 3. For any new vehicle on the CPS, permission must first be obtained by the full committee with the club CPS person having the final say.
- 4. Any vehicle in dispute will be submitted to a committee vote and the ruling is final.
- 5. Any breach of these conditions will mean that the vehicle will not be renewed at its renewal date.
- 6. Please check at the front of the newsletter to see who is available to sign renewals and new vehicles or contact our CPS Person.

The club has been invited to display our cars at this prestigous event at the Phillip Island Raceway. Celebrating it's 27<sup>th</sup> consecutive year the Island Classic will see a celebration of racing that has spanned over a quarter of a centry making the event one of the most iconic historic motorcycle event in the world.

This classic will feature a century of motorcycles from pre-war to the new era machines. There will be motorcycles dating from pre WW1 to Vintage (1920-1945), Post Classic (1963 – 1972), Forgotten Era (1973 – 1982) and New era (1983 – 1990) division.

Champions from past and present will be there and we will have access to the pits, pit lane and every other area of the race track.

To attend this run I must have numbers at least 2 weeks before the event. To get into the track with your car you will need to tell them your name at the gate so its important to let me know ASAP so I can forward names and numbers to the organisers.



Guided Tour of Fort Queenscliff.

FEBRUARY 23<sup>RD</sup>.

Meeting Point: Avalon Highway Rest Stop BP/Hungry Jacks.

Time: 8:30 for a 9:00 Depart.

<u>Guided Tours.</u> Enjoy the rare opportunity to join a guided tour of a 19th Century Coastal Artillery Fort (operating as an Australian Army Base) with over 150 years of Australia's heritage on display. You will see historic Fort features covering activities of an artillery garrison and hear about an artillery soldier's life between 1860 and 1946, and the activities of the Department of Defence to the current date.

A tour of the Fort takes approx. 1 1/2 hours and includes a visit to the ammunition magazines buried under the cliffs of Shortland's Bluff, & to gun emplacements which reveal the gun crew's amazing views of the RIP to protect Port Phillip from attack by enemy ships. Photos are allowed.

Entry gates to Fort Queenscliff are located in King Street, Queenscliff. Photographic I.D. for all adults is required at the gate. Gates open 10 minutes before the tours start.

No public toilets are located inside the Fort.
