



#### **RUN REPORT.**

#### **SUNDAY 14/8/2022**

#### "PIG & WHISTLE" TRENTHAM EAST

DRIVING INSTRUCTIONS AND POINTS OF INTEREST SUNDAY OUTING. By Rob and Anne Quinn.

Leaving the Keilor Pub Car Park, we will be turning west (right) along the "Old Calder Highway" route and proceed through Keilor Village up and out of the "Keilor Maribyrnong River Dip" to the Taylor's Lakes large roundabout at Sunshine Avenue, where will be turning right (about 5kms). This route will take us past what we call "Keilor's Quality Row", where some of Keilor's finer homes are located.

After turning right at the Taylor's Lakes roundabout, immediately try and get your vehicle into the left lane, so you can turn left at the next roundabout (about 150m) this will get you onto route number C754 which is the "Keilor Melton Highway".

We will proceed in a westerly direction along route C754 through the suburbs of Taylor's Lakes, Sydenham and Hillside to the Plumpton Road large roundabout, where we will turn right (about 10kms) onto Plumpton Road. As we pass out of Hillside, you will note on the left, the massive new housing projects underway. All the land that lies between Ballarat Highway, and Keilor Melton Highway that extends all the way to Melton has in recent years been rezoned residential (14kms from Hillside to Melton!).

We will proceed along Plumpton Road for around (4kms) to turn left at Holden Road. This is an offset intersection with signage on the right indicating direction to Toolern Vale and Russo Estate Winery. About 300m along Holden Road you will see signage (left) and a rock cairn (right) commemorating the first powered flight in Victoria, by of all people, Harry Houdini, early last century.

Continue along Holden Road to its terminus with route C706 (about 5kms). Following signage turn left here and proceed to the hamlet of Toolern Vale (about 6kms). This stretch of road takes us past many horsey type of large country properties.

On reaching Toolern Vale we will proceed past the famous General Store and turn right at the roundabout onto route C705 to Gisborne (about14kms). This road is a great little drive for your classic car, with rolling hills, nice corners, climbs and some downhill runs. Don't get too carried away, as the kangaroo population in this area is very healthy. I found out the hard way a couple of months ago, and destroyed the bonnet on my Morris Minor convertible, very scary!

As you approach Gisborne on route C705 you will pass Gisborne Secondary College on your right and then the Gisborne Cemetery on your right, at the roundabout turn left and head down the main street of Gisborne (Aitken Street). We will not be stopping at Gisborne so continue on and out the other side of the town. Route C705 (Aitken Street), for a short

distance, will become route C791 as you head up the hill out of Gisborne. As you crest the hill you will see a road on your left called Ross-Watt Road (this is in fact a section of the old Calder Highway) turn left at Ross-Watt Rd. Be alert, as it is easy to miss this turn.

Proceed along Ross-Watt Road for around 4-5kms and turn right at the intersection and head under the Calder Highway bridge to a roundabout and take exit route C322 Mt Macedon Road.

Follow route C322 up the mountain for around 10kms to Cameron Drive the Memorial Cross Road route C328. On the way up the mountain take in your surrounds, its a great drive. Some of Victoria's finest homes and gardens are located on the slopes of the mountain, many of these properties are open during the very popular Autumn Festival each year, something not to be missed by garden gurus. Take care when turning at Cameron Drive as it is easy to miss, and is a reflex angle, uphill off camber left turn. For the older cars, given the slope in one area is 1 in 14, you may require a little vigorous use of the gearbox, great fun!

Follow Cameron Drive for around 4kms to its end, at the car park at the "Top of the Range Tea Rooms". A stroll to the Cross is mandatory, maybe a cup of tea or coffee at the Rooms, a look around and a few photos. Public toilets and picnic grounds are also available. We will not be staying too long, as we have a lunch date with the Pig.

Return along Cameron Drive to the intersection with Mt Macedon Road route C322 and turn left and follow Mt Macedon Road down the back side of the mountain to Woodend (follow signage).

Entering Woodend on Mt Macedon Road, it becomes Brooke Street and unfortunately you can only turn left at the main street of Woodend, which is High Street, we need to turn right. So, we need to move over one street to the right. So, if you turn right from Brooke Street at either Wood or Templeton streets and then left onto Urquhart Street this will lead you to High Street, where you can do a right turn at High St.

Heading downhill on High Street you will need to turn left at the bottom of town onto the Tylden/Woodend Road route C317, "Bourkies Bakery" is on the left corner. At Tylden route C317 becomes route C318 Kyneton/ Trentham Rd we will follow route C318 until we almost enter Trentham at the "Blue Trentham" town sign we will turn left onto Pearsons Rd which will take us directly to the "Pig and Whistle". Clear signage is located at the Pearsons Rd turn.

Please note, there are other routes into the "Pig and Whistle" that are sign posted along our route, with small black and white road signs to our right. These roads are not great and should be avoided, stick to the above route!

When departing, head back the way you came to Woodend and follow the signage back to Melbourne, via the Calder Highway for a quick return.

















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
